Andrew is very attached to his younger siblings, Dillon and Logan.

Dillon can be described as very energetic. He loves the outdoors, playing video games, and playing with his toys. Dillon thrives on positive attention from adults and would benefit from consistency, structure and knowing his boundaries with adults. Dillon also struggles academically and is currently on an IEP. He receives counseling and medication management to help him stay focused and on task. In addition, he also receives OT and PT and speech services.

Logan is a friendly playful little boy who loves to explore his world. He is affectionate and loves attention from his foster family. Logan is very active and loves playing with his brothers, being outside and swimming. Logan attends preschool and is socially on target and interacts well with his peers. Logan is being monitored by various medical specialists due to issues with his heart, his acid reflux and his size. Logan does have some speech delays and receives speech therapy. In addition, he also has OT and PT services. The consistency and nurturing Logan receives in his current placement has helped him progress in his development.

Andrew, Dillon and Logan would do well in a two parent family where there is structure, consistency and a strong support system. The family would need to have lots of patience, time and energy to keep up with 3 very active boys. Andrew, Dillon and Logan would do well with other children in the home, preferably older children due to the time and attention required to meet their special needs and advocate for them in all areas. Their forever family must be open to community services providers and follow through with recommendation to meet their needs.
