PURPOSE

- This Collaborative expresses a community commitment to respond to children in need during crisis or placement needs. These are multi-systemic children.
- One of the goals is to ultimately prevent youth from becoming more systeminvolved by giving community professionals an avenue to discuss barriers and needs while coming up with solutions in real-time.

GOALS

- To enhance communication, define system interventions and coordination between each of the teams serving multi-system youth with moderate or intensive behavioral health needs.
- · Clarify roles and define the responsibilities and expectations for each organization.
- Create a mechanism for care coordination between agencies including the development of a multi-party consent for release of information and sharing information.
- Identify clear care paths as well as a decision tree to promote smooth referral process.

CONSULTATION PROCESS

- This is a multi-step process.
- You must fill out the Case Consultation Referral Form via Google form: https://docs.google.com/forms/d/1DSYvopuASPobil19_uvXm8_mogEGyyo4qiEuFMl2Omo/prefill
- Once submitted you will be contacted via email by a member of the Family Collaborative within 1-2 business days.
- A Release of Information and Summary Form will be emailed to you, please fill them out accordingly and email them back to loraincountyfamilycollab@gmail.com to confirm your time slot for consultation.
- The 'professional' requesting the consult will utilize the Collaboration Guideline for the presentation.
- Presentations should be no longer than 30 minutes so that sufficient time for a robust discussion, asking questions, problem-solving, and developing an action plan if needed.
- An action plan or recommendations may be developed and will be sent to all parties of the collaboration.
- At the following Collaboration meeting, there will be a brief follow-up discussion at the beginning of the meeting if needed.
- If a consult is needed before the monthly meeting, the MHARS designee will schedule a meeting on the first Thursday of the month at 3 pm.
